Successful organization of 23rd convocation

The 23rd convocation of Acharya Narendra Dev University of Agricultural and Technological, Kumarganj Ayodhya was presided over by the Chancellor and Governor Smt. Anandiben Patel on 20th December 2022. The chief guest of the program was eminent scientist Dr. Mangala Rai, Ex DG, ICAR and Sri Laxman Singh Rajput, Minister of State for Agriculture in the Government of Uttar Pradesh was present as a special guest. The Chancellor presented Chancellor's Gold Medal to 7 PhD students, Vice Chancellor's Gold Medal to 11 students and University Gold Medal and citation to 7 students and degrees to 498 students. Addressing the convocation, Chancellor and Governor of Uttar Pradesh Anandiben Patel, saluted the Padma Shri awardee Mohammad Sharif, for his selfless work for human kind. There is a need for continuous changes in the agricultural education system. She said that the central and state governments are committed to the welfare of the farmers, doubling the income of the farmers, zero cost farming including cow based and natural farming is the full focus of the Prime Minister of the country. During the convocation, Chancellor Mrs. Anandiben Patel honored 11 progressive



farmers from 9 districts for their excellent work in agriculture. While advising the students who got the degree, she said that one should go to the farmer's house and solve their problems. She said that today the 11 progressive farmers with whom I got a chance to communicate at the convocation, have given us immense happiness; we also met such farmers who are giving training to other farmers. This clearly shows that the farmer is completely selfless. Governor Smt. Anandi Ben Patel appreciated various varieties of paddy, mustard, tur, amla, ber and bael developed by the Agricultural University. She also



instructed the school teachers of the honored during the function to keep their books as libraries in the schools. Addressing the program, she said that by forming a team of teachers and children, they should work to take forward zero budget farming so that the poor can come out of BPL. Addressing the program, the chief guest, eminent scientist Dr. Mangala Rai said that work speaks today or tomorrow; there is discussion all around today of sustainable farming, profitable farming, intensive farming, market-oriented farming and contemporary farming. He said that there will be many shortcomings at many levels, if you work, then there will be mistakes too, but those who count the shortcomings and mistakes can never see the pinnacle of success. Whatever is there, the feeling of what is less, fills the lack and gives inspiration to do good work even in the absence. Learning something new from every mistake paves the way for growth and development. While discussing the truth, he said that truth is that which is eternal. Eminent scientist Shri Rai, the symbol of culmination of knowledge and biology, Shri Ganesha, the symbol of culmination of biotechnology, defeating the speed of the mind, the son of wind, Hanuman and the aiming at words, the many divine weapons of the body with the word-blade arrows show a glimpse of our ancient development. With the spirit of keeping knowledge and science as their friend for life, expressed their blessings to the students who got the degree and also counted the development and research work done from the establishment of Agricultural University till date. Addressing the program, Vice Chancellor Dr. Bijender Singh enumerated the achievements of the Agricultural University one by one, and said that 101 daily wage workers have been regulated by me just a few days ago, while talking about resolving all the problems of the university employees. . Vice-Chancellor Shri Singh informed that the farmers' cabinet has been constituted by the university, in which 2 progressive farmers of 26 districts have been selected. The problems related to agriculture, new agricultural techniques developed in the cabinet are also being discussed today. He informed that 25 Krishi Vigyan Kendras and four Krishi Gyan Kendras and half a dozen Crop Research Centers are being run in 26 districts. Counting the achievements of the university, he said that on the basis of one district one crop and one district one product, Krishi Vigyan Kendras are continuously working to increase the income of the farmers and provide employment opportunities.

International day for women and girls in science celebrated on 11th February 2022

International day for women and girls in science was celebrated by the college of Veterinary Science on 11th February 2022 with webinar on "Role of women in Agriculture sector for making India Self Reliant". The Guest Speaker Padma Sree Dr Sosamma Iype, Former Director CAS, Animal Genetics and Breeding, Kerela pressed upon conservation of indigenous breeds and asked girl students to come forward overcoming all inhibitions. Dr Alka Goel, Professor and Dean, College of Home Science, GBPUAT briefed about the scope of community science in building nation. An awareness Campaign was also organized at PG Girls College Dehli Bazaar to promote more and more participation of girls in science in which Dr Namita Joshi, Dr Satyavrat Singh, Dr Naveen kumar Singh and Dr Vibha Yadav interacted with the girl students of science background, briefed them about the women who have brought laurels for country in



science and urged to take science stream as their profession. International Women's Day was also celebrated by all the 25 Krishi Vigyan Kendras of the Directorate of Extension. In which women were honored as well as information about agricultural production technology was given. Altogether 1800 farm women participated in this program.

"Kisan Samman Diwas"

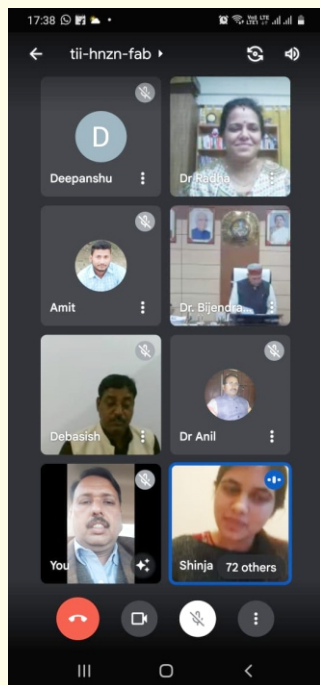

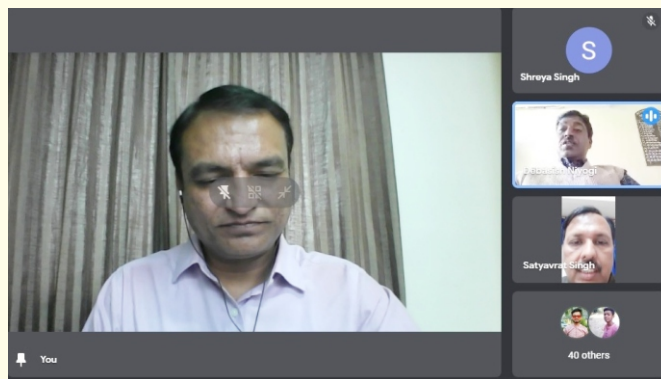
Soft skill and language development training

Blood Donation Camp

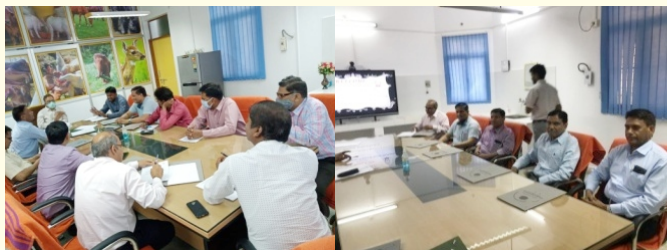
Blood donation camp was also organised on 26th in which 35 students donated their blood the camp was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. A total

Similarly, Under the Biotek Farmer Hub project, a demonstration of DBW 222 variety of wheat was organized in village Katra Bahadurganj, development block, Chittaura district, Bahraich and field visits were made to local farmers.

Crop residue management farmers' fair

Under Crop Residue Management, 07 Krishi Vigyan Kendras organized a district level big farmer fair. A technical exhibition of various aspects of crop residue management was also displayed during the fair. Altogether 7682 farmers and farm women



participated in these fairs. In the fair, the Vice Chancellor of the University, Dr. Vijender Singh and Director, Extension, Dr. AP Rao threw light on crop residue management. This year there has been a



reduction of about 85 percent in burning of crop residue as compared to last year and its residue is being used for increasing soil health.

Human Resource Development Training organized

Under Human Resource Development Training by the Directorate of Human Resource Development, Acharya Narendra Dev University of Agriculture and Technology, Ayodhya, dated 14-15 March, 2022, the subject matter experts and technical



personnel of different subjects working in 25 Krishi Vigyan Kendras were given recent advances in soil analysis and Nutrition Management, March 15-16, 2022 Integrated Farming System for Doubling Farmers Income, March 21-22, 2022 Natural Farming and March 22-23, 2022 122 trainees were trained on Office Management and Public Finance Management System.

Capacity development on profitable dairying

Director Extension Dr. AP Rao informed the trainees on the implementation method of completing the work on time, emphasizing on the technical point of increasing their efficiency. Under capacity development at 17 Krishi Vigyan Kendras out of 25 Krishi Vigyan Kendras run by Directorate



of Extension, 200 trainees were trained by each center through five training courses to make dairy profitable. Each training course was conducted for three days. In this way a total of 3400/- farmers were transferred technical knowledge through 85 trainings to make dairy technically profitable.

Introduction of an Apple variety H.R.M.N.99 at farmer's field

Progressive farmer Sri K.C. Mishra, District Basti planted an Apple variety H.R.M.N.99 before two years and now, getting fruits on plant. In sub Humid condition an apple fruits on plats were miracle for other farmer's. The adoption of this technology is easier to farmers after seeing on progressive farmer field. The K V K , Basti supported by training, pruning and fertilizer management etc. technology time to time.
